#### **OVERVIEW OF THE CAEP**

#### Targeted, Fast-Track Support to Update and Enhance NDCs

The CAEP gives clear and coherent signals that resources will be made available for developing countries that wish to raise the level of ambition in their updated NDCs.


It aims to assist countries in achieving two overarching objectives:

- OBJECTIVE 1: Enhance NDCs, including by raising ambition, as part of the Paris Agreement's NDC update process, allowing countries to submit updated NDCs to the UNFCCC by 2020;
- OBJECTIVE 2: Fast-track implementation of NDCs, by providing in-country technical expertise and capacity building with a focus on the mobilization of finance for climate action.



### WHO WILL BE ELIGIBLE

Developing member countries committed to strong climate action with requests meeting the following:





# **COUNTRIES INTERESTED IN REQUESTING SUPPORT**

#### For Objective 1: Enhance NDCs Including Through Raised Ambition

The strongest requests will be concrete and detailed, and include:

- Evidence that the revised NDC will result in a significant positive impact on greenhouse gas emissions or significantly improve the resilience of vulnerable populations.
- Existence or preparation of mid/long-term sectoral or development strategies, or 2050 pathway, and plans for aligning the revised NDC with these.
- Analysis of costs and benefits using the government's macro-economic modeling or other relevant methodologies, models, or data.
- Underlying data and monitoring, reporting, and verification (MRV) system.
- Linkages with the NDC Partnership ongoing work, based on the Country Engagement Strategy.



# **COUNTRIES INTERESTED IN REQUESTING SUPPORT**

#### For Objective 2: Fast-Tracking NDC Implementation

Proposals should focus on capacity development interventions that will lead to more effective deployment of financing. These could include:

- Macro-economic modeling and budgeting.
- Financing strategy.
- Long-term strategy development.
- Project pipeline development.
- Development of financial regulations and/or instruments.



#### **HOW IT WILL DELIVER**

#### Leverages Member Resources and a New Technical Assistance Fund

All members in the NDC Partnership are invited to commit support to requesting developing member countries.

Support will be delivered through:

- Existing and new resources and expertise from NDC Partnership members;
- A dedicated Technical Assistance Fund.

The Technical Assistance Fund is a pooled funding mechanism with contributions from multiple development partners which will allocate resources to institutional and associate members with the required expertise but without available resources to respond to requests.



#### **HOW TO APPLY**

# Countries can Apply through the Online Application Form (Available at: http://ndcpartnership.org/caep)

General guidelines when completing your application:

- Applications must be submitted in English.
- Only one application can be submitted per country. Account details (username and password) have already been shared with focal points.
- You are required to assign a contact point for your application. This contact point is expected to respond to any clarifying questions or requests for additional information.
- Applications should be endorsed by more than one ministry, including the ministry of finance or planning.

First call for requests announced in Abu Dhabi.

THURSDAY,

8
AUGUST 2019

First call for support requests ends.

FRIDAY,
23
AUGUST 2019

Eligible country requests sent to implementing partners.

FRIDAY,

6
SEPTEMBER 2019

Deadline for implementing partners to respond.

- All support should be deployed by November.
- A second call for requests will take place in October.
- A third call for requests may occur if funds remain.



#### **KEYS TO SUCCESS**

- Prioritize and be specific in what you are asking for.
- Get buy-in from key stakeholders first.
- Consider planning and development priorities.
- Reflect on areas where it has been hard to obtain support in the past.
- Seek to address challenges in the first round of NDC preparation and implementation.
- Leverage this opportunity to raise ambition.
